

There are many filters on the market and, after testing, we decided the PUR Scout™ is the best choice. Compact (9" x 2 1/4") and lightweight (20 ounces) the Scout is not just a water filter like most of its competition, but a water purifier which eliminates even viruses. It pumps at up to one liter per minute, and its design makes pumping easy. Its replaceable purification cartridge capacity is approximately 200 gallons. Includes a StopTop™ which is both

a bottle adapter and a carbon filter to remove unpleasant tastes. The PUR Scout™ will pay for itself quickly in bottled water and Immodium® savings, and will last for years. When not on the road, it's an essential item in a home emergency kit.



The concern in most countries is the theft of personal belongings. Using our security supplies should cut your risk of theft dramatically.

The Eagle Creek Endless Journey pack is without a doubt the best pack for a Walkabout, be it short or long. It's a 3 in 1 extra large travel pack with the character of a wilderness pack with travel convenience built in. It features Eagle Creek's improved Comfort Zone® carry system, with includes Hydrofil® nylon which is soft yet keeps you dry, HDP molded torso adjustment for better load control, redesigned spinal and lumbar pads, parallel internal frame, and adjustable load control straps. Beefy, lockable YKK zippers throughout. Internal cinch straps, pleated front outside pocket, tie-down lash bars. Has a handy side carry leather hand grip. The main pack has a divider that creates a separate compartment for sleeping bag or dirty laundry, but the divider can be zipped open if you prefer one large compartment. The rear panel unzips to become a daypack with a front panel to organize your smaller items. A waist pack zips off the bottom access panel.
