FILM NEWS



Oto Island, and I met a man called Yamie who said he would be my guide. I thanked him and paid him \$5.00. That night, during the festival, we heard some old man talking about something called "Gojira." He warned us and told us to escape while we still could.

After the festival I was quite full and I was just about to go to sleep when a loud bell started to ring. I ran outside to see what was going on. A group of people ran past me towards the mountain. I took after them. About half way up the hill, a massive head come over the mountain. I froze in my tracks. I could not believe it. I whipped up my camera and took several shots and ran like hell to the boat. Back in Tokyo, I showed my pictures to a friend of mine, Dr. Serizawa. He examined the pictures and called a science conference.

At this conference, I could see Dr. Yamu from the University of Tokyo and Dr. Honda from the University of Nagisagy. Dr. Seriazwa began.

As he backed up, the fins on his back started to glow and from his mouth he beamed a luminous ray that turned the towers white-hot. They were melted into steel blobs! Gojira then sighted the city and proceeded lumbering toward it.

Anything in his path was destroyed. Buildings, houses, cars, people--all demolished. Suddenly, he turned around and headed back to the bay. Now in his path were tanks and heavy artillery. They started firing but the shells just ricocheted

off Gojira!

He walked right through the firing line, crushing men inside the vehicles. Gojira returned to the water and descended into its depths.

After watching the holocaust, I went to see Dr. Serizawa. He said I would be very interested in something he had in his cellar. We went down to see what he called the "OXY-DESTROYER." He took a small pellet from a locked iron box and dropped in a tank of fish. First the water bubbled, then boiled, then everything settled. I looked into the tank and saw nothing except at the bottom of the tank, the skeletons of dead fish and the husks of dead plants.

I was totally amazed. I congratulated Serizawa on his remarkable achievement. If he could make a larger pellet, he could destroy Gojira!

The train hurled off the tracks below the creature. Gojira, irritated, seized the train in his teeth, the people inside screaming wildly as they were crushed to unrecognizable figures.

Gojira smashed my hotel to pieces, while his tail demolished a tractor trailer. Gojira's fins started to glow and he beamed his ray at Tokyo's oil storage tanks which were totally demolished. By then, all over Tokyo, explosions were occurring. The whole underground oil system was going up.

His havoc completed, Gojira again returned to his watery home.

Later I met Serizawa at the now-ruined docks. We went to his boat which was equipped with sonar.
