


Far East Heroes Update:

Ultraman Taigo, Tristar Godzilla, Ultracom gets axed, Ultraman on home video and other news...

Ultraman news:

There have been recent developments in fandom that may effect the future of Ultraman in the United States. Evidently, the entire staff at Ultracom, Inc., the official Ultraman license holder outside of Japan, has been "terminated" and the company will cease to exist on August 15, 1996. Sources close to these developments have told Heroes that Tsuburaya Productions of Japan caught wind of the problems Ultracom gave fan-based publication Ultra-Fan and was not very happy at all! Ultracom sent a lawyer's letter to Ultra-Fan, telling them to "cease all coverage of Ultraman"including photos, articles and even mentioning the name "Ultraman" because it violated copyright/trademark laws! This letter was apparently sent to Ultra-Fan magazine after Ultracom allegedly promised not to "pull a Toho" i.e. bother the magazine! Sources say that Tsuburaya of Japan loves Ultra-Fan and that they were very upset that the fans were being treated badly by **Ultracom**. Ultracom had already been the target of numerous fan complaints when they ceased publishing their "Questclub" newsletter leaving many people hanging! Many in fandom became critical of Ultracom as the company did little if anything in trying to get Ultraman proper exposure in the United States. There's an old saying "What comes around, goes around". Sources say that Tsuburaya Productions of Japan has expressed interest in helping out with Ultra-Fan magazine. To what capacity this involvement would be is not known at this

time(official sanctioning? press releases? photos?).

Also, by now you probably know that a company called <u>"Excellance in Animation"</u> has bought the rights to the original "Ultraman" series for release to home video. They will be at G-Con 96' with a presentation on how they will handle our beloved hero and his return to American television!

Details are still early, but Far East Heroes has learned that the name of the new Ultraman show Tsuburaya is working on is called "Ultraman Taigo" or "Ultraman *Tiga*". The show will begin airing on Japanese station TBS in September. Heroes hears that this new Ultraman may get his energy from the sun, like his fellow brother, Ultra 7! The storyline centers around previous "Ultra Monsters" returning to Earth, united in trying to conquer it along with Ultraman Taigo and his brothers for good! Monsters already mentioned for the series include the fan-favorite BALTAN ALIENS and ZETON! Details on cast and the number of episodes is being kept under wraps by Tsuburaya of Japan. Heroes can safely say that numerous cameo appearances by previous "Ultraman" actors can be expected. Heroes has also been informed that the reason that ULTRAMAN NEOS was scrapped was because the potential investors didn't like the storyline. It evidently strayed to far away from Tsuburaya's established "Ultra Mythos". The investors reasons seem to be "Why create new monsters and characters when you already have numerous, fan-favorite, well known monsters and situations!?" So it appears that Tsuburaya will be bringing back some old friends! Here's hoping they bring back ZAREB, KERONIA, DA-DA and MEPHILAS! The

Ultraman Wonderful World Movie has hit Japanese home video. The movie consists of three segments 1.) Revive, Ultraman! a compilation of "new" footage and stock footage using the monsters Woo, Gango, Dodongo and Zeton. 2.) Ultraman Company-an animated superdeformed Ultraman parody 3) Ultraman Zearth-the best segment of the movie featuring a new Ultraman-Ultraman Zearth battling the gold eating evil alien Benzen and his friend the evil Kottenpoppe monster! The special effects are excellant, the fight/battle scenes are done well and the original "Ultraman" cast makes cameo appearances-Hayata, Fuji, Captain Mura, Ito and Arashi, see if you can spot them! Heroes hears that Ultraman Zearth may be involved in further adventures. He is a popular new character and Tsuburaya has gotten alot of postive feed back. It remains to be seen if he will appear again in "Ultraman Taigo" or have his own series.

Gamera news.

Feedback on the new "Gamera vs. Legion" movie is that the film is 100% better than the already good "Gamera: Guardian of the Universe"! The effects and story are said to surpass anything Toho has done with their recent Godzilla films. Gamera 2 is said to "borrow" scenes from the recent Toho Godzilla movies only these scenes are done better! Kind of like "see Toho, we can beat you at your own game!" The film is doing extremely well in Japanese theaters ensuring a Gamera 3 which Heroes hears planning has already begun. Gamera 3 will hit Japanese theaters fall of 1997 with another new monster foe. hears that Daiei Company wants to come up with new enemies for Gamera and not "remake" old foes, the direction that Toho took their recent Godzilla movies. In related news, Dark Horse Comics has secured the comic rights to Gamera and all his monster foes! Dark Horse will also cancel their Godzilla comic because off the record, they are upset with Toho's high price tag to license Godzilla. The "official" stance from Dark Horse is that sales were low.

Trendmasters News.

Trendmasters Toys has secured the toy rights to Gamera and Godzilla vs. Destroyer! Trendmasters will release Gamera and Destroyer toys this fall. Trendmasters may be showing prototypes of these toys at <u>G-Con 96'</u>.

Tristar Godzilla news.

Roland Emmerich and Dean Devlin (Independence Day, Stargate) will do Godzilla for summer 1998. They are currently writing a script that will be a "re-make" of the first Godzilla film. Heroes thinks that the pair will try to get Toho to ease up on license rights to use King Ghidorah in the movie, otherwise the pair will come up with an all-new foe for Godzilla to face. A brief in-joke in the Emmerich directed "Independence Day" shows a young boy playing with a King Ghidorah action figure! Is this a clever clue to Godzilla's foe in the new movie or just a nod to Godzilla as they knew they would be making the movie? Heroes has heard Emmerich and Devlin are partial to King Ghidorah

hopefully, they will be able to use him!

Toho news.

The new "Mothra" movie is said to revert back to the mid 70's. It features two young brats and a good fairy they befriend and the evil fairy they must stop before it releases the terrible "Death Ghidorah" monster. Hopefully.

Kawakita and company will make up for the "kiddie" story with some good effects scenes. A source has said that "Death Ghidorah" resembles the creature "Dodongo" from Ultraman, it has 4 legs and it's body resembles a horse and has 3 heads like King Ghidorah. The source stated that it although the storyline may be more kiddie like, people will probably like Death Ghidorah as a character.

Heroes hears that from fan pressure, Toho Studios kept baby Godzilla alive at the end of Godzilla vs. Destroyer. Both Godzilla and baby Godzilla were to die in the movie, making it the very last Godzilla film ever. The end. No more. Forever. Nevermore. Toho had planned that Tristar would make the American Godzilla movie and that Toho would release that movie to Japanese theaters, still making money on Godzilla, but not actively filming the movies anymore. The plan was to have Tristar make sequel films to Godzilla. therefore keeping "Godzilla" alive and also making Toho lots of cash. Toho caved into fan pressure after receiving numerous fan complaints and petitions to keep Godzilla alive. Now it appears that Toho will make another Godzilla movie around the year 2000. Heroes would predict the winter of 1999 would most likely be the release time for the proposed next Toho Godzilla film.

In related news, don't believe anything you read about a "Doomsday King Ghidorah" movie that will be released on New Year's Eve 1999 by Toho. The rumor is totally false and was apparently started by some internet freak and was posted as some sort of "Toho press release". Heroes would give friendly advice that you shouldn't believe

everything you read on the net!

Did anyone think that <u>Godzilla vs. Destroyer</u> should have been called <u>Godzilla vs. ALIENS</u>!? I mean, Toho basically copied exact scenes from Twentieth Century Fox's popular "ALIENS" movie, the Japanese self defense forces use guns that look exactly like "pulse rifles", they use "motion trackers", the monsters have an inner set of teeth that they shoot out at their victims, the creatures bleed bright yellow blood like the Aliens, hell, the advance artwork for Destroyer on the poster looks like the damn Queen Alien! episodes for \$9.95 and is in SP mode.


Toei Co. has released a new hero show-Changerion to Japanese television. The show features a hero who wears shiny, see-thru armor who battles all sorts of cool monsters. The series is shot on professional home video, taking a clue from Tsuburaya of Japan and how they filmed Gridman and the two recent Ultra-7 mini movies.

Toho and Capcom Companies have released a joint production television show-Guyferd. It's a cross between Ultraman, Gridman and Guyver. Again, Toho seems content with "borrowing" other people's property and using it for their own purposes. It's the usual story of a guy who has a parasite attached to him that can cause him to change into a superhero to fight monsters.

The company "<u>Excellance in Animation</u>" is said to be looking into other Tsuburaya Ultraman properties to coincide with a potential "*Ultraman: 30th Anniversary Celebration*" video package for American release.





G-CON 96': GODZILLA CONVENTION RETURNS TO CHICAGO! (Fans of Godzilla . Ultraman, Gamera and Japanese Sci-Fi, Fantasy meet in Arlington Heights . ILL. for a weekend to honor their favorites from the land of the Rising Sun).

A year ago in August 1995 history was made in Chigago in Arlington Heights, ILL. The Radisson Hotel was the site for the first ever in North America, G-CON 1995: The GODZILLA CONVENTION! It was thrown in honor of the world's favorite radioactive mutant dinosaur. As a result of last year's success and demand by fans who attended it, G-Con is back again for 1996! Over this weekend the Radisson Hotel in Arlington Heights will once again be ground zero for hundreds of fans of GODZILLA; along with other favorites like ULTRAMAN, the popular giant flying turtle GAMERA, the bug-eyed hero KAMEN RIDER, the SUPER SENTAI (task force) series, and other favorites of Japanese Fantasy who will come from all across the country and around the world to honor their favorite monsters and heroes of their favorite genres of Japanese Sci-Fi Fantasy! "G-Con 96': A Celebration of Japanese Sci-Fantasy", will cover everything on the subject, which according to many fans is a big step and an achievement for their favorites of Japanese Sci-Fi and Fantasy. Despite the popularity in their native land of Japan, these shows still get little respect and dignity here in this country by television and movie communities.

G-Con is a fan run convention. According to convention chairman and organizer John Rocco Roberto "G-Con is a convention by fans for fans". Roberto says his experience with Star Trek conventions was turned into horrible nightmares. "Trek cons concentrate on mainly making money from the guests, dealers room, and also charge high admission fees. With G-Con our main focus that Trek Cons tend to forget, is on the fans!". Like last year's G-Con, Roberto says "We will preserve the same friendly and informal atmosphere that characterized the last G-Con". He says "If G-Con starts to even resemble a STAR TREK Con, even I will stay away"

G-Con began it's roots two years ago when a group of fans of GODZILLA including Roberto, started writing for the fanzine G-Fan, a bimonthly publication of THE GODZILLA SOCIETY OF NORTH AMERICA, who decided to get together to talk, form friendships and discuss their hobby that they enjoy best, their love of GODZILLA! Many of these fans corresponded by mail,

phone, internet and most of all, through G-Fan. The publication originally began by a classified ad in STARLOG Magazine by editor, and publisher J.D.Lees. After the group had their meeting they voted to have the meeting again on a wider scale to invite more people who shared their hobby as well. The vote was overwhelming! Setting up the stage for the first ever G-Con! (Godzilla Convention). Roberto along with G-Fan editor J.D. Lees and a host of their closest G-friends set up at the Radisson Hotel in Arlington Heights in Chigago. Roberto explains that Chicago was a good choice for the con because it was central to everyone which was a great place to meet. When G-Con made it's debut last year on August 18, 1995 it became an overwhelming success! Originally, the con was only open to the people who purchased advanced registration thru G-Fan magazine and was a closed event, but when the con was publicized in the CHICAGO TRIBUNE, the response from people who became aware of it prompted Roberto to open it to the public on Sunday August 20, 1995. "G-Con 96' Roberto says, will be bigger and better with more programs, presentations, more dealers specializing on merchandise based on not just only Godzilla but all of our favorites of Japanese SF and fantasy such as ULTRAMAN, GAMERA, KAMEN RIDER, DAI MAJIN, SUPER SENTAL and more! GODZILLA will still be our main focus but we are covering many other famous legends of the genre because of the great demand of the fans who attended last years G-Con!".

It is not known if Toho Co Ltd (the owners of Godzilla) will support or endorse this year's con. Last year Toho refused to even acknowledge the con and even refused permission to let the G-Con staff screen their two latest Godzilla movies GODZILLA VS MECHA-GODZILLA (93) & GODZILLA VS SPACE GODZILLA (94) which both have not still been released here in the U.S. However, parallel to Toho's stern actions, Daiei Co. LTD (the owners of the giant flying turtle known as GAMERA), had no objections whatsoever about the showing of their product's comeback film GAMERA, THE GUARDIAN OF THE UNIVERSE at G-Con 95' and that film quickly became the most talked about film for the G-Con 95' weekend. As a result of their films success, Daiei Co. LTD has made a sequel film GAMERA 2-GAMERA VS LEGION, which was just recently released nationwide in Japan. Just recently A.D Vision, a U.S video company, bought the rights to Gamera: The Guardian of the Universe which is slated to be released this fall in theaters all across the country! Fans have high hopes that GAMERA will do well here. The movie will be later released to video after its theater run. Hopefully the release of GAMERA will prod Toho into rethinking their strict stance about releasing their latest 90's G-movies (Godzilla vs

King Ghidorah, Godzilla vs Mothra, Godzilla vs. Mecha -Godzilla, Godzilla vs Space Godzilla and Godzilla vs Destroyer). One main reason Toho has not released their new movies in the U.S. is their deal with Tri-Star Pictures and their "American" Godzilla movie project. Recently Tri-Star has revealed that their production team for the film will be under the direction of Roland Emmerich and Dean Devlin (Stargate and just recently Independence Day). According to the team they are scapping all the script work of the recent old poposed story and will go back to the very first original Godzilla (1954) movie and remaking that movie. Devlin and Emmerich say "It will be a complete page on rewrite!". Emmerich will direct the epic with Devlin producing. According to reports the new GODZILLA will feature mostly model cities and suitmation (man in a suit) monster which will combine with computer generated imagery and animatronic models like in Jurassic Park. Tri- Star has reported they have scheduled GODZILLA for release in the summer of 1998. A discussion about the film is scheduled at G-Con 96.


As well as GODZILLA and GAMERA being talked about at G-Con 96°, others in Japanese SF fantasy will be present. ULTRAMAN: the giant red and silver super-hero from Nebula M78 who is very much beloved here in this country by fans who still remember him since watching his original series when it was syndicated on T.V. in the 70's and early 80's, will also be talked about. Japan has enjoyed over 30 years of Ultraman. This year, Tsuburaya Productions (the owner of Ultraman) is celebrating ULTRAMAN'S 30th Anniversary (1966-1996) with events, merchandise and just recently released a theater movie ULTRAMAN WONDERFUL WORLD FESTIVAL and is hard at work producing a new ULTRAMAN series for the 96' and 97' season for Japanese T.V. The late Eiji Tsuburarya .the special effects genius behind GODZILLA, also created ULTRAMAN who would be a popular icon for Japanese T.V. like Godzilla is in Japanese movies.

Others like KAMEN RIDER, SUPER SENTAI(Task force)
TEAMS also popular in Japan, will be covered at the con. Such shows with their popularity in Japan were the inspirations for Saban Entertainment's popular Mighty Morphin Power Rangers, Masked Rider and V. R Troopers now on U.S. t.v. everywhere. Japan has enjoyed many years of these popular shows which America has just recently rediscovered after such shows like ULTRAMAN, SPECTRAMAN, JOHNNY SOKKO and his Flying Robot, Space Giants and many others disappeared off U.S. airwaves in the early 80's. Although many hard


core Japanese genre fans don't like companies such as Saban, editing the Japanese shows for US viewers

GODZILLA ON VIDEO

(Current 90's series on Video In Europe Beats America)

I usually don't do articles concerning GODZILLA,

THE KING OF MONSTERS. I mainly cover

ULTRAMAN but there is a first time for everything and doing this article of GODZILLA is one of them.

To begin with something recently happened with GODZILLA that compelled me to do this review to get this problem off my chest, since I'm a good fan of the Big G; the old saying goes "just let it out" so I'm letting it out.

A few weeks ago I recently received a video from one of my friends in which he bought it in Europe and converted it NTSC format for me to watch. The video was *GOJIRA TAI MOSURA (GODZILLA VS. MOTHRA)*. The 1992 updated version and it was dubbed in *English*! I was stunned and couldn't believe that one of *GODZILLA'S* current movies had been dubbed and released on video (but in another country outside of Japan). *Manga Video*, a very popular video distributor well known in importing and distributing of Japanese Fantasy ranging from anime to movies in Europe had bought the rights to the current new *Godzilla* series from TOHO CO. to release the films there on video. As many fans know here in the U.S. *GODZILLA 'S* current films from *GODZILLA VS*

KING GIIIDORAH up to GODZILLA VS.

DESTROYAII has not been released on video here yet.
However, the films are coming out in Europe. I hate to say
this but I must because this event has caused me to be
more than just unhappy its caused me to be upset and angry
and hopefully it'll awaken video distributors.
The release of the new G films in English in Europe really
stage our video industry in the face. Plus it's embarassing!

slaps our video industry in the face. Plus it's embarassing! Europe's won the race getting the new G films out on video. Well they deserved to win. Manga Video has done what American video companies have not done for years! Its disgusting and shameful. There is a saying "Where can the blame be put on?" It can be placed on three principle topics money, greed, and people in power which is why the Big G's new films haven't seen the light of day on video here as of yet. Let's take a look at these three topics and see why the current ongoing series of GODZILLA is still not out on video here.

MONEY: It boils down to money. American video companies just does not want to sink any money into TOHO to purchase the films.(Remember again the hassle with GODZILLA VS BIOLLANTE). After what happened with Miramax Pictures and TOHO, this caused other U.S. film companies with connections with the video distributing industry not to purchase the other G films for either theatrical or video release. If Tristar's proposed big budget GODZILLA FILM does well hopefully this will change. If they ever get started on filming their film which I doubt they ever will, the situation with video releases will change. However, don't get your hopes up. Money is the

key issue. Will they spend the money on GODZILLA to make money on GODZILLA?

GREED: This is **TOHO'S** department. Many companies who have dealt with **Toho** over the years have come to a conclusion that **Toho is** not very reasonable when licensing their products to companies who are interested in leasing them. **Toho** wants lots of money especially for video release and distribution of their films which has made U.S. distributors balk and turn away from getting any of the current films. If **Toho** would ease their high prices on the video distributors, they might buy the films and release them here, either dubbed or subtitled and people here would surely purchase them!

PEOPLE IN POWER: It boils down to this topic. The people in power. It's up to them if they want purchase the G-films and unfortunately they don't want to . Many think its too risky of an investment. Plus, they don't want to pursue any of the films not even Henry Saperstein and his company UPA, who 's had the licensing right to GODZILLA. For many years he has not touched any of them. I've been told Mr. Saperstein is not very fond of the Big G's current films. I wish the people up there realize GODZILLA can be even more successful if given the proper exposure. Trendmaster's has a popular GODZILLA toy line, Dark Horse Comics has a popular Godzilla comic, Manga Video of Europe has the rights to the new G-series movies, why can't the United States get these films?

To sum up Manga Video in Europe, they are beating

the U.S. in getting GODZILLA'S current series out on video and it is a reminder that their video distributing has seen the light. Their people wanted and demanded CODZILLA'S 90'S movie series and they got him. While here in the states we must wait for the people upstairs who control the video industry, the power, and the money to wake up and smell the coffee to get their act together which, unfortunately for them, are only missing out on the Big G's films. Maybe only Tri-star's proposed G-film will open the door for us if their film is a success. For now Europe's Manga video has won the race and deserves the praise, glory, and of course profit while our video distributors continue to stall and ignore the new G films. Hopefully, I really do hope this slapping in the face by Europe's Manga Video will awaken Tri-star, UPA, and others in our video distributing industry to start doing something in putting our favorite radioactive "you know who" on the small screen! Manga Video in Europe has proven "it" to all. It can be achieved! No question about it!







Where is ULTRAMAN?! By Robert A. Dagg



Many Kaiju fans have probably been wondering the same thing, just where is ULTRAMAN? After the classic original 1966 show left American airwaves in the early eighties. Ultraman has returned only once with the so-so ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE, which ran in limited release on television in 1991.

Of all Japanese fantasy icons, ULTRAMAN is probably the most well known in America after the King of Monsters: GODZILLA! Devotion from American fans still runs deep for the hero from Nebula M-78, although to this date, no official release of the original series has been secured for home video. The only live-action ULTRAMAN series to find a home on legitimate home video is ULTRAMAN:TOWARDS THE FUTURE available from L.A. HERO.

Many ULTRAMAN fans also still don't realize that an "AMERICAN" ULTRAMAN show was produced in 1994 for us! ULTRAMAN: THE ULTIMATE HERO was Tsuburaya Productions gift to American ULTRAMAN fans, as they know that ULTRAMAN is a beloved hero in America as well as Japan! Unfortunately, the show thus far has failed to pick up any interest from American distributors. The series was eagerly awaited by ULTRAMAN fans in the U.S. as well as Japan, but didn't live up to the standards to which with fans hold Tsuburaya's giant hero. An American production staff was hired, who later admitted that some of them had never heard of ULTRAMAN! The 13 episode series was meant to appeal to fans of the original series by bringing back familiar foes like BALTAN, RED KING, DA DA, ZETON and PYGMON. Tsuburaya also thought that they would be "reworking" the original long time fans, as well as appealing to a new generation of "young" ULTRAMAN' fans. It's destiny seems to be some type of home video release in America. Tsuburaya is to be commended though for addressing American fans, unlike another major Japanese studio where the big G resides, Tsuburaya seems to really care about it's American fans.


In terms of American "official" ULTRAMAN merchandise, only a small handful of products have seen store shelves. The BANDAI ULTRAMAN:TOWARDS THE FUTURE action figures, PLACO

ULTRAMAN stuffed dolls . T-LINE DESIGN'S ULTRAMAN T-shirts and the previously mentioned home video release of ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE by L.A. HERO. There are also apparently PEWTER figures of ULTRAMAN and some of the ULTRA monsters like BALTAN and RED KING. While this may seem like a decent amount of ULTRAMAN merchandise. finding these items readily is almost impossible! The ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE BANDAI figures are pretty much cleared off toy shelves (you may still be able to find them in mark down bargain bins), the PLACO STUFFED ULTRAMAN DOLLS have been spotted on some toy shelves but have been disregarded by most ULTRAMAN fans as "to childish", "overpriced", and "poorly rendered". The T-LINE DESIGNS T-SHIRTS are probably the easiest to find in terms of ULTRAMAN products (although there are reports of this company not returning information to interested consumers) and the "BREAK THROUGH" logo of ULTRAMAN in his "SPACIUM" pose is great. The shirts are also priced to buy. The PEWTER figures, although nice, seem a bit high in price and no one knows where to find them. The same can be said for L.A. HERO'S video release of ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE, somewhat hard to find all 13 episodes and priced a bit steep at \$ 14.95 per episode. You may also still be able to find ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE SUPER NINTENDO game based on the series. This game was also produced from BANDAI VIDEO GAMES.

What many American ULTRAMAN fans seem to want are home video releases of all the ULTRAMAN series in the U.S., a huge line of ULTRAMAN ACTION FIGURES (comparable to Bandai of Japan's line), a decent COMIC BOOK series, unlike the horrible NEMESIS series, watches (announced but have yet to materialize), posters, video games, books, magazines, music c.d.'s, a more diverse clothing line like jogging pants, sweat shirts, tennis shoes, lunch boxes, hats, more T-shirts featuring ULTRA monsters, and laser discs to compliment the home video release of the entire ULTRAMAN series in the United States.

Tsuburaya Productions of Japan is celebrating ULTRAMAN'S 30th ANNIVERSARY / BIRTHDAY all year long, with special video releases, THE ULTRAMAN WONDER WORLD FESTIVAL THEATRICAL MOVIE, new toy releases along with a load of new "special 30th ANNIVERSARY" merchandise, and is working on a new ULTRAMAN series slated for release in 1997 that will surely be the best ULTRAMAN series to date!

As for American fans, we will most likely have to celebrate ULTRAMAN'S 30th ANNIVERSARY for ourselves. It appears that fans in America can only continue to hope that a certain "ULTRA" licensing agency will finally see fit to release ULTRAMAN to home video and to start realizing there is a huge market for ULTRAMAN in the United States. There is a rich 30 year history to Tsuburaya Production's ULTRAMAN and American fans for the most part, are missing out on it. It's a 30 year treasure chest of Tsuburaya goodies that has thus far only been slightly cracked open. Hopefully, American fans won't have to wait much longer for our hero to return to a place where he is beloved by thousands and thousands of fans—the UNITED STATES!





Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero

A.K.A. Ultraman Powered.

It is no small secret that **Tsuburaya Productions of Japan** has been trying to break back into the lucrative American television market. Having had a successful run with their original Ultraman series in the 70's and early 80's, **Tsuburaya** decided once again to launch their hero Ultraman in the United States in the 1990's.

Starting with Ultraman: Towards the Future, Tsuburaya Productions decided to take a new direction with their hero and make the series more accessible to Western fams! The studio would film Ultraman: Towards the Future in English! The first Ultraman series ever to be filmed in a language other than Japanese! The result of the Australian co production was positive enough for Tsuburaya Productions to finally green light the first ever "American" Ultraman series: Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero.

Effects genius Eiji Tsuburaya had often told his peers of his fondness for Hollywood movies and often speculated what a Hollywood produced Ultraman series would look like. Acting in part for his father's wish, Noburu Tsuburaya set out to produce the new series.

Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero, produced by Tsuburaya Productions in association with Major Havoc Productions, Inc. is the tenth entry in the long running Ultraman series.

The entire 13 episode series was filmed in the United States(the first time ever) and is the second Ultraman series to be filmed in English! The filming was done for the series on Los Angeles soundstages and "on location" sets.

In order to "re-introduce" Ultraman to the American audiences, Tsuburaya decided to bring back familiar Ultraman monsters from the *original* 1966 series and "rework" some of the original storylines. Tsuburaya thought that these "changes" would appeal to fans who watched the *original series* on American television and also appeal to a new generation of young American fans.

The storyline; the evil Baltan Aliens invade Earth, reviving evil monsters and aliens! The World Wide Investigative Network Response Team or W.I.N.R., is created in order to combat the invasion!

Ultraman, having chased the Baltans to Earth, chooses W.I.N.R. member Kenichi Kai to become his human partner. He gives Kai the new Beta-Capsule, a device that will transform him into Ultraman in times of great danger!

The following are episode titles and the monsters that appear in each episode. The

original Japanese titles have been translated into English as closely as possible.

Unfortunately, Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero is probably the weakest entry in the 30 year old Ultraman series. The show as of 1996 still has not found television syndication and is likely to be released straight to home video. The series has received very lukewarm, bad reviews and as much as I hate to admit it, deserves them.

The first problem with the series is the lack of episodes. With only 13 episodes, television syndication companies find that "strip running" or showing the show daily Monday-Friday is all but impossible. Shows like **Saban's Mighty Morphin Power Rangers** are popular because a vast number of episodes are available to run without having to repeat episodes every other week.

Second, and probably most important, is the fact that a director was hired who didn't know anything about Ultraman! King Wilder, director of Ultimate Hero, has stated that he had to watch the original Ultraman series to find out who he was! He had no idea who or what Ultraman was! Evidently, Tsuburaya Productions of Japan saw of King's work with low-budget film company Full Moon Entertainment and was impressed with his handling of movies with small budgets and extensive special effects. While his actual directing of Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero wasn't that bad, it was how he filmed the "hattle fight scenes" that got fans infuriated! Simply put, the fight scenes were poorly choreographed and filmed in slow motion! Fans who are used to the way that Tsuburaya Productions of Japan films it's fight scenes were throwing bricks at their televisions watching King Wilder's Ultraman fight scenes! Even fans in Japan have voiced the same complaints as their American friends-the action and fight scenes are too slow and dull!

However, there are some positive things about Ultimate Hero. The redesigned monster costumes are for the most part excellant! Kevin Hudson(Predator, Batman) really shows he took the series to heart. The Kemular, Red King, Telesdon, Gabora, Aboras and Banilla costumes all deserve mention for the extreme detailing and craftmanship! Many of the monsters feature blood shot eyes, pulsating veins, sharp claws and fangs and plaque covered teeth!

Also nice are the pyrotechnic effects by Hollywood pyrotechnic effects master-Joseph Viscocil(Star Wars, Empire Strikes Back). Joe practically waived his fees for Ultimate Hero because he had always loved Ultraman!

The Mecha designs are also great. Vehicles for the series were designed by Mahiro Maeda, Shinji Higuchi(Gamera: Guardian of the Universe) and Toshio Miike.

In conclusion, Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero failed to live up to the high expectations that fans hold the "Ultra" series to. While the people hired to make the series tried their best, they simply had no idea what they were getting themselves into. They didn't know the material and it shows in the final product. Tsuburaya Productions is to be commended though, as they addressed the American fans with the series. Why they didn't hire Steve Wang (Guyver 2:Dark Hero) to direct is beyond me! Here's a guy who can direct and do the special effects all in one! Oh well! As the old saying goes—"If you want something done right, you have to do it yourself!", it looks like Tsuburaya Productions will do just that with Ultraman: 1996 to start broadcasting on Japan's TBS NETWORK in September of this year!

Probably one of Tsuburaya's most overlooked "Ultra" series, Ultra Q was the first series in the long running "Ultraman" series that dealt with mostly giant monsters and strange occurences.

Oddly enough, the show didn't feature any giant superheroes, just three regular people Jun Manjome, Ippei Togawa and Yuriko Ebogawa who constantly came in contact with all sorts of weird creatures and strange events!

Not having any superheroes to bail them out, Jun, Ippei and Yuriko often used mankind's own technology to battle any aliens, monsters or other undesirable events.

The series is probably one of my favorite Tsuburaya produced

television series. All the episodes are well written, the special effects are great, the actors all turn in believable performances and the show reeks of atmosphere! To refer to the series as a cross between X-Files, The Outer Limits and The Twilight Zone wouldn't be far off, although Ultra Q hit the airwayes long before any of these shows!!

It's a shame that this series along with just about ever other *Ultraman* series has failed to find a home on legitimate home video either dubbed or sub-titled. Hopefully, this situation will be corrected in the future. There is a 30 year treasure chest full of **Tsuburaya** goodies that American fans for the most part, are missing out on!

As Benndar's sphere disappears beneath the nearby Gomori Lake, Havata's ship accidently collides with Ultraman's ship and Hayata is killed instantly Ultraman, feeling guilty for what he has done, decides to share his life essence with Hayata. He gives Hayata the Beta-Capsule, a device that will transform Hayata into Ultraman in times of great dauger! They yow to fight for the peace of the Farth for all time!

Needless to say, many evil monsters and aliens decide it's the right time to try and invade Faith! What else do giant monsters and aliens have to do!!? Only the Science Patrol and Ultraman can save the day!

Hailed by most in fundom as the "series that started it all", Ultraman went on to become one of Japan's most beloved heroes. The expertise of Eiji Tsuburaya was present as the show captivated audiences with excellant special effects, excellant scripts and storylines, loads of memorable monsters and aliens and an excellant cast that put the icing on the cake!

The show was so popular, it spawned numerous toys, books, posters, lunchboxes, tennis shoes, clothes-you name it, the Ultraman series probably was a part of it! The show even played on *American television* in the mid 70's to early 80's and quickly won the hearts of school kids and young adults all over America!

To this day, Tsuburaya Production's of Japan has kept the "Ultra" mythos alive with new specials, movies like the 30th Anniversary Ultraman Wonderful World Festival, Ultraman: The Ultimate Hero, Ultraman Neos, new products, toys, merchandise and not to mention the devotion of Japanese and American fans!

ULTRAMAN IS NO ORDINARY HERO!

As a child, I remember waking up early Saturday morning, (6 a.m. to be exact!) and quietly tip toeing into the living room. With great anticipation, I would turn on my television set, with the volume at a low setting so that I would not wake my parents. Before the t.v. picture tube could present a picture, I would have the channel already set to the station that was about to broadcast a show that had caught by imagination and awe, and unbeknownst to me, would hold it forever! That show was ULTRAMAN! Every week was a new adventure and every week it just kept getting better!

Now as an adult. I find it hard pressed to be able to remember exact details of the original 39 episodes, but with what I remember, I know to this day it is the most original and impressive show of it's time. That silver and red giant that we know as ULTRAMAN, changed the way I looked at superheroes. The most impressive feat I do recall is the two part episode (PRINCE MONSTER 1&2) in which ULTRAMAN battles GOMORA. It was the topic of heated discussion with kids all over the neighborhood. I can't remember ever being disappointed with any monster battle, it's just that GOMORA stands out in my mind. Even with that said, the one thing I always waited anxiously for was the BETA CAPSULE scene in every episode. Next to the visual appeal of the ULTRAMAN costume, the BETA CAPSULE was the most exciting part of the show! The scene was a masterpiece of dramatic film work. The sound of the BETA CAPSULE would cause me to well up with excitement! The transformation scene that accompanied it, has left a permanent impression on my childhood memories. I can even remember the music that was played every time ULTRAMAN fought a monster!

When my eldest son was 5 years old, he brought up the topic of superheroes and asked me which of them was my favorite. It took me all but 2 seconds to respond with the name ULTRAMAN! He sat in awe as I

described what I had remembered about ULTRAMAN. His first exposure to ULTRAMAN came a few years back when I found "ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE" at my local video store. After watching the video my son was hooked just as I had been in my childhood. Before we knew it, we had the ULTRAMAN: TOWARDS THE FUTURE video game for the SUPER NINTENDO, the TOWARDS THE FUTURE BANDAI TOY FIGURES, we even collected the ULTRAMAN COMIC BOOK series that was released at the time as well. It was through these comics that we learned of the ULTRAMAN QUESTCLUB, an ULTRAMAN FAN CLUB organized by ULTRACOM, who were at the time in the midst of preparing to market a new ULTRAMAN series tentatively entitled "ULTRAMAN: THE ULTIMATE HERO". The OUESTCLUB NEWLETTERS (2 in total) kept us up to date as to how the production was going along then suddenly, nothing! It was if QUESTCLUB rolled over and died! (It turned out to be what happened) Almost two years passed, still no word from the source of info there was on our hero. I wanted my son to experience the power of the original ULTRAMAN series, so I went to work. ULTRACOM informed me that it was not available on video anywhere in the United States. After quite a bit of digging, I finally wrote to a Japanese Live Action Monster Fan Club (FAR EAST HEROES t.m.) in Dearborn, MI and through the generous work of that club's founder/publisher, I was referred to someone who was able to provide me with tapes of the original ULTRAMAN series! Needless to say, not only did the series bring back memories, my whole family enjoyed the experience. Along with myself, my wife and child, we still don't understand how a show like the POWER RANGERS could get picked up by networks, and have a series like ULTRAMAN passed by. The only reason I could think of is simple. No one knows what they are missing! If people could be exposed to the ULTRAMAN SERIES, they would want more!!!

Anyone who has ever been exposed to any of the ULTRAMAN series, has the same opinion. They belong to a small but growing group of people who know about the world's best kept SUPERHERO SECRET:

ULTRAMAN! It is sad to think that the t.v. networks (Along with ULTRACOM, INC.-ROB) alone can decide if we get to see a show like ULTRAMAN or not. With the proper exposure of the ULTRAMAN shows, these series would be where the POWER RANGERS are right now! In any case, I know the time will come when ULTRAMAN will take his rightful place on NORTH AMERICAN television screens. It all depends though, on how much WE AS FANS ARE WILLING TO WORK TO HAVE OUR

It almost seems as if BIG COMPANIES are always looking for certain action shows from Japan like POWER RANGERS OR GRIDMAN. (Yeah, just ask Lenell Bridges about it'-Rob). They insist shows like these are their money makers. Well, if they took a little time to look just a little bit closer, they would find that all these shows are based on ULTRAMAN! Without the influence of the ULTRA series, these shows would not be popular as they are now.



Saban's MASKED RIDER

It seems Saban Entertainment has did it again. Just as they made Mighty Morphin Power Rangers and V.R. Troopers now they have made a new series called Masked Rider for the U.S. small screen T.V. The series made its debut last fall on Fox T.V. in the Saturday morning time slot. Masked Rider utilizes footage from TOEI Company's famed Kamen Rider long running T.V. series (Kamen Rider Black and Kamer Rider RX to be exact) and splices new footage of American actors to the fight scenes (Like Rangers and VR Troopers). It seems Saban hasn't learned anything yet. Alas, I can't give Masked Rider a good review. In fact its the most uninspiring series I've ever seen! It is bastardization of a Japanese work at it's worst! Let's face it, Saban nor other U.S. companies try as hard as they might, they can't duplicate a Japanese work and this series says it all. Masked Rider is the shame to the popular Kamen Rider series. The Japanese series is thousands of times better! Masked Rider combines a serious Japanese series with comedy. Like the comedy of Roseanne. A deadly combination, which comes out into a confusing mess which could make long times fans of the Japanese genre violently ILL!

The series tells of the adventures of a young prince from the **PLANET EDENOI** named **Dex** (*T.J. Roberts*) who by his grandfather is king of the Planet and is given powers to go to the *Planet Earth* to defend it against the

evil of Count Dregon and his army of EVIL. INSECTZOIDS who want to conquer it. (What else did you think?!-Rob) Dex is adopted by a kind family and is taught to live like a Earthling. When Count Dregon and his army strikes, Dex uses his powers to become Masked Rider to battle Dregon and the insectzoids he sends. The stories depicts Dex's battles despite the added (less violent) "American" scenes, however, it doesn't help this show! Not one bit. In fact it's not even a good laugh either! The acting is terrible by both the hero's and villians in the series. The acting in the "Small wonder" T.V. series is better, and that's really scary. The stories are totally stupid. The music is pathetic and even the new villians they added to replace the Japanese ones aren't impressive. Plus, even their design of the Masked Rider costume looks cheap(The Jupanese version is 100% better). Lastly, they severly cut down on the action content which is in most Kamen Rider series. Saban is bowing down to pressure from parents to cut down in the violence in their programming. The fighting scenes and SPX is badly edited. Plus, I can't take that funny furball Febus creature. He reminds me of the Ewoks in Star Wars and he makes a jackass of himself just like the actors do.

In short Masked Rider is a good laugh of a show geared for the kiddies as usual. Like I mentioned, I have not seen as of yet one example where an Americanized show is better than its Japanese counter part. Why TOEI Company is selling out to Saban is beyond me. Why TOEI is letting Saban turn their popular shows into monsterous bastardizations is beyond me (Mayhe it's this-\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$S\$\$\$Roh). I wonder what Japanese fans would think if they saw

this show! Don't even ask! (Yeah, but I'm sure TNT loves this show!-Rob) There's a saying "If it ain't broke don't fix it". Saban wanted to fix Kamen Rider for the U.S. viewers, instead they turned it into something worse. It would have been easier to just dub it and release the original Japanese series as it was originally. It would've been time and money saving but alas, Saban is only after the money these shows can bring from the ratings from T.V. and from merchandising, what else is new!(Preach on. brother!-Rob). While Kamen Rider (in Japan) rises to the heights with GODZILLA, ULTRAMAN and GAMERA in the aspects of good stories, acting, SPX and of course popularity, MASKED RIDER sinks down to the awfullness and silliness you would find in Barney the Dinosaur. In fact I hate to admit it but DYNAMAN (of Night Flight) and ULTRAMAN: THE ULTIMATE HERO is better than this show of MASKED RIDER. The Japanese Toei show -Kamen Rider is available on import video (If you know where to look). Watch Kamen Rider and compare to Masked Rider you'll notice the difference and I'm sure you'll pick Kamen Rider. When will Saban ever see the light? (When TNT shows unedited and redubbed Ultra-7 episodes in chronological order, letterboxed in prime time-Well, maybe not-Rob). Probably never! MASKED RIDER REALLY STINKS!!! I would rather watch a 12 hour non-stop marathon of SEA HUNT, Gilligan's Island, Emergency or Little House on the Prairie than to sit through 30 minutes of this trash. Like MASKED RIDER. SUPER HUMAN SAMURAI SYBER SQUAD

When one company, Saban in general, has a huge hit show like the Mighty Morphin Power Rangers, another company has to jump on the bandwagon. D.L.C. Entertainment decided to do just that. They did it with Super Human Samurai Syber Squad. D.L.C. made this show using Japanese footage from Tsuburaya's Denko Cho Jin Gridman television series. Out of all the shows to get imported these days. Syber Squad in my opinion is the worst! It's so bad it's even lamer than that Power Rangers crap! I've seen the original Gridman show and it's far better than this "Syber Squad" series! The scripting and story ideas in Gridman were pretty bad, but Syber Squad is even worse! After I watched the first episode, I nearly puked! D.L.C. and the boys really screwed this show up! Here's the facts to back up my opinion on this show's review. Don't say I didn't warn you!

The stories of the episodes don't make sense and are stupid. The music which they use is also terrible. Even the music in the original series of **Gridman** was far better (especially in the battle scenes). The actors and actresses in **Syber Squad** don't even give good performances. In fact, they make fools of themselves! The acting looks like it was done by amateurs, even the villain of the series, **Kilokahn** (**Khandejifer** from the original series) is treated like a joke in this series! Also the intended humor is not even remotely funny. Why did they even change **Gridman's** name to **Servo!?** It's bad enough they cut the show to pieces, but calling **Gridman**, **Servo** was uncalled for!

The only thing good about the series is the Special Effects by Tsuburaya Productions of Japan! They are excellent! Tsuburaya has proved once again they are the masters! Unfortuantely, the bad dubbing in those parts downgrades the battle scenes as well!

In short, Super Human Samurai Syber Squad is so bad it's worse than the flawed original series! It's one of the worst offenses to American fans of Japanese sci-fi-fantasy that this show was hacked to pieces! I have not seen a show as terrible as Syber Squad! (Rob here-At least until he saw Saban's Masked Rider!) If you have not seen the original series, try to find episodes on import video uncut! You can compare for yourself the hack job between Gridman and Super Human Samurai Syber Squad! You'll see the difference! However, if you like Syber Squad, go for it!

Super Human Samurai Syber Squad is a perfect example of an original show from Japan that could have actually been improved upon, but is instead hacked to pieces! I have not seen one example of an American show that is better than the original Japanese version! If you haven't seen Syber Squad, don't even bother trying! It's so screwed up, it stinks! You haven't missed a thing!!

TRENDMASTERS GODZILLA TOY LINE REVIEW BY PAUL GALINS



It was refreshing to see more positive commentary on the Trendmasters Godzilla line in G-Fan #20. I am not ashamed to say that they have done an excellent job and that I own quite a few of the little rascals! Okay, they're not 100% successful in all things but they succeed in ways the Bandai versions don't seem to.

First, they're solid. Literally so in the 4 and 6 " figures. They achieve exactly the "play value" they claim to. A friend of mine who also owns the large Bandai collection, calls them "stunt figures". They're the ones he let's his kids play with. Since the 10" Space Godzilla and Gigan came out they're the only ones they play with anyway. These figures are built and painted to go where no Bandai has gone before and return home intact!

Second, they're *cheap*. Generally quite well rendered and **REPLACEABLE!** I say generally well rendered, as some are either decidedly more *faithful* to their film appearance or are more interestingly interpreted than others.

Current aces in the whole are:

* 10" MechaGodzilla. Nicely done with lights and sound for about \$10 less than the smaller plain Bandai version.

* 10" and 6" Space Godzilla. Great sculpt especially the near perfect 6"!

*6" Mogera. Also worthy of note for good sculpt/appearance.

* Pop Up Rodan. Unusual but a great sculpt of Rodan with the Gargoyle flavor.

* Godzilla vs. Biollante in Washington D.C. What can I say?

It's an election year!

Upcoming releases include Anguilas and Mogera in 10" form and possibly Biollante, all late next fall. Those who missed the first wave of figures in 1995, now largely unobtainable, fear not! They will be re-released in the Godzilla Wars line. The plush toys have not been picked up as yet by stores due to concerns that their electronic roars would be too scary for their young owners! New 2-packs will feature the big guy in four different poses fighting a new 4" foe from the Godzilla Wars line. The new pose is worthy of much praise.

Now....the rest of the story(apologies to Paul Harvey).

Strongly finishing in the WHAT WERE YOU
THINKING? catergory is the 10" Gigan. The sculpt on the box is excellant so why the radical change? He started out far better than the Bandai version.


*Walking Godzilla. Non option. Skin too loose, detail poor, head to soft. NEXT!
