

MOBILE SUIT GUNDAM--Member Kevin Grays has supplied us with the following plot synopsis for the wildly popular animated SF series GUNDAM:

Certain factions of Earth's populace have taken to living in immense outer space stations in the space year 0079. Earth falls under seige by an alien raced armed with gigantic Mobile Suit Zak robots, and Earth moves to defend itself by creating its own giant robot force. Young Amuro Ray dreams that someday he can fight for Earth and control the mightiest of Earth's robot force, Mobile Suit Gundam. Amuro constantly studies the robot's

functions, hoping that his dream may someday come true. Sure enough, during a surprise raid by Zak forces, Amuro and his female companion Frau Baw seize

sabre. Amuro dispatches the enemy. Impressed by Amuro's skill and bravery, Bright Noah (chief of operations for Galactic White Base) befriends the young man and acts as his mentor. Meanwhile, . Char Aznable, the ruthless enemy leader, unleashes another Zak robot to threaten the inhabitants of Lunar 2. Amuro and Gundam spring into action and intercept the invader high above Earth. Gundam is near defeat when the two battling robots begin tumbling into the atmospere and burning up. Amuro quickly searches through Gundam's operating manual and manages to find a device which activates a heat shield on Gundam, protecting Earth's avenger from sharing the same fiery fate as its opponent.

Char sends one of his evil agents, Garma, to penetrate Earth's defenses and attack White Base. Amuro's friend Kai Shiden controls the gun cannon tank robot in an attempt to repel Garma's attack, but he is outmatched by superior alien forces. Over Bright Noah's

vehement protests, Amuro brings Gundam to Kai's rescue. Brandishing his giant shield and deadly beam rifle, Gundam devastates the enemy, smashing their ships with his powerful legs. Suddenly, Gundam is confronted by a Zak robot, and Gundam is severely damaged while defeating the Zak.

Garma launches an all-out offensive against Earth using an entire army of Mobile Suit Zaks. Gundam is repaired and leads the Earth robot force against the Zaks who are destroying all in their path. The robot armies wage a ficrce battle amidst Earth's largest cities. When his forces face inevitable defeat, Garma heads his command ship for a collision with White Base, but instead he falls short and crashes into the rubble of the decimated city. Another of Char Aznable's attempts at conquest has failed.

But Char is not yet finished with Earth. After the enemy empire conducts a memorial service for its fallen warrior Garma, a new Mobile Suit Zak is devised—a formidable destructive device equipped with an electrical cable whip. In a spectacular climactic battle, Gundam defeats the Zak and White Base is able to continue its journey through space, ever watchful of another attack


by the notorious Char Aznable.

Though MOBILE SUIT GUNDAM: THE MOVIE was quite well received in Japan, the second film adapting episodes 14-30 of the tv series was not accorded equal praises by Japanese fans, thus dimming fan enthusiasm for the next GUNDAM feature which is planned for release sometime in the near future. However, Gundam fans have not been disillusioned enough to warrant discontinuation of Gundam's enormous merchandising campaign!

RECENT RELEASES ON JAPANESE TV..... Among the series under current rebroadcasting on various stations across Japan are Tsuburaya Production's ULTRA SEVEN, ULTRAMAN TARO, and MIRROR MAN.....YAMATO BE FOREVER was shown on August 19, though slightly edited for television. This was just part of a mini Yamato festival, as SPACE CRUISER YAMATO (the original movie condensation) and YAMATO THE NEW VOYAGE were also shown during August ... Making its Japanese tv premiere on August 9 was GODZILLA VS. MEGALON.... New animated tv series include GO SHOGUN and Tatsuncko's SADAMEBIUS, the former being the usual giant combination robot fare and the later being a space opera.....CYBORG 009 also has returned for the fall season reruns....

AND LOOK WHAT HAS BEEN RELEASED TO AMERICAN TELEVISION.... Two of Toho's science fiction films produced in the 70's but heretofore unseen in this country have finally been picked up by U.S. distributors for television release. CATASTROPHE: 1999 (NOSTRADAMUS NO DAYOGEN--1974) has begun to crop up on local stations around the country under the title THE LAST DAYS OF PLANET EARTH. Not to be confused with

the recent Sun Pictures exploitation filmed titled THE LATE GREAT PLANET EARTH. this Toho film had gotten theatrical release in most of the major world markets except the United States during the 70's. CATASTROPHE: 1999 deals with the calamaties which threaten the Earth in the face of rampant pollution and overpopulation. The respected actor Tetsuro Tanba (recently seen in Toei's MESSAGE FROM SPACE in the role of Commander Ernest Naguchi) plays the role of an environmental scientist who investigates the many weird events occurring around the world and warns of man's ultimate demise. LAST DAYS OF PLANET EARTH is actually the same version of CATASTROPHE: 1999 which was released in Great Britain a few years ago. It was dubbed by the same British voice actors who also dubbed the versions of GODZILLA ON MONSTER ISLAND, GODZILLA VS. THE COSMIC MONSTER, and TERROR OF MECHAGODZILLA that were released theatrically in this country. Among the few scenes edited from the American release of this film is the images of World War III -- after nuclear missiles have destroyed most of the populace and killed even the military personnel who launch the missiles, nuclear warheads continue to be launched by computers, dramatizing the senseless overkill of nuclear war.

The other Toho science fiction film of the 70's to be picked up by American television is THE WAR IN SPACE (WAKSEI DAISENSO--1977). Again, the United States has been the last of the major world markets to receive this film. Rather poorly received in Japan during its domestic release in 1977, WAR IN SPACE was rushed into production rather hastily in order to capitalize on the anticipation growing in Japan for the upcoming release of STAR WARS. Unfortunately, a rather sloppy, weak film was the result. Toei's decision to take its time



in producing its STAR WARS take-off seemed to pay off in comparison. THE WAR IN SPACE concerns the exploits of space battleship UNSF Gohten (looking much like a souped up Alpha/Atragon hybrid) against evil invaders from the planet Hell. this film is not intended as a seguel to Toho's 1959 film BATTLE IN OUTER SPACE, it does star Ryo Ikebe who also appeared in the 1959 space adventure. Here, Ikebe plays the role of the scientist/ inventor of Gohten who takes his ship and crew to Venus to confront the aliens who would conquer the Earth. With American distributors rather reluctant to release Japanese SF theatrically (a fear enhanced by MESSAGE FROM SPACE's mediocre boxoffice showing), the tv release route seems to be the only hope for Americans to see Japan's newer SF crop. Certainly, WAR IN SPACE did not do anything to convince U.S. distributors to think otherwise. Hopefully, this will not reflect negatively on the chance for theatrical bookings for VIRUS, ULTRAMAN HERO FROM THE STARS, or any possible future Godzilla adventures.

Nothing new has developed recently on ULTRAMAN HERO FROM THE STARS as all parties involved have been rather quiet on the subject as of late. Of even greater concern, however, has been the prolonged silence on the prospects for a new Godzilla film which less than a half a year ago had been strongly rumored for Toho's 50th Anniversary early in 1982..... However, Toho has not been totally inactive in the field of sfx films as RENGO KANTAI (THE GRAND FLEET) was released on August 8. Starring a number of familiar Toho actors such as Tetsuro Tanba, the special effects in this World War II sea epic were said to be rather inconsistent. Though the scenes showing off the huge miniature battleships in action were enthusiastically received, scenes involving fighter planes were said to be sadly lacking in their execution. Additionally, stock footage from other war films and actual combat footage was intermixed with the new scenes, making for an unsettling effect..... The music for RENGO KANTAI was composed by Masaru Sato.....

LATE BREAKING NEWS.....August Ragone informs us that MGM has just announced

plans to release Osamu Tezuka's animated feature PHOENIX 2772 (1980) to theaters in this country. This masterfully animated space adventure will be titled SPACE FIREBIRD, and it has reportedly already been dubbed and edited with post-




