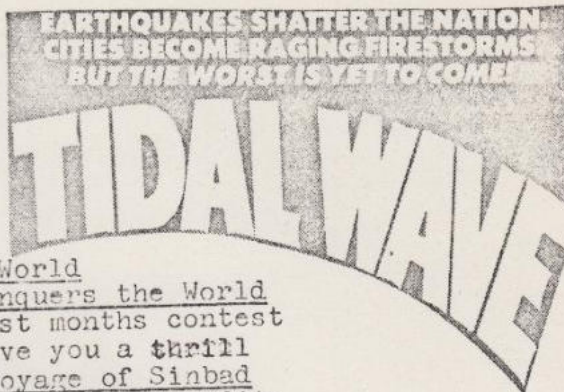

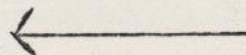

The Enterprise Incident

Star Date: 5027.3 ( Medical Log )

Apparently without orders from starfleet, a tense and irritable Kirk takes the Enterprise into Romulan territory. Three Romulan ships surround the Enterprise and demand that Kirk surrender the ship, a valuable prize. Learning that Kirk's first officer is a Vulcan, they order both men to beam aboard the Romulan Flagship. Kirk explains to the female commander that insurmountable failure caused their unwitting entry into Romulan territory, but Spock admits that Kirk ordered it because of his own mental instability. This infuriates Kirk. The Romulan commander orders Scott to take the Enterprise to their base; he refuses. She tries to convince Spock to defect; he seems to weaken. McCoy is called to the flagship to tend to Kirk, who seems quite unbalanced. Kirk attacks Spock, who counters with a Vulcan death grip. McCoy returns to the Enterprise with Kirk's body. However, in reality, Kirk was only stunned; he and Spock were under Federation secret orders to steal the Romulan cloaking device. Kirk is disguised with pointed ears by McCoy, and the Captain returns to the Romulan Flagship. The commander has been doing her best to seduce Spock and seems to be succeeding. Kirk gains access to the cloaking device, & beams to the Enterprise with it. The commander discovers the theft, but is too late. Now she is determined to execute Spock. While Spock buys time in an involved "confession", Scott installs the device on the Enterprise. The Enterprise beams Spock aboard, and accidentally beams the Romulan commander on too. Tal, the Romulan subcommander, gives chase and is ordered to destroy the Enterprise by the commander. But the cloak works, and the Enterprise escapes with the device.

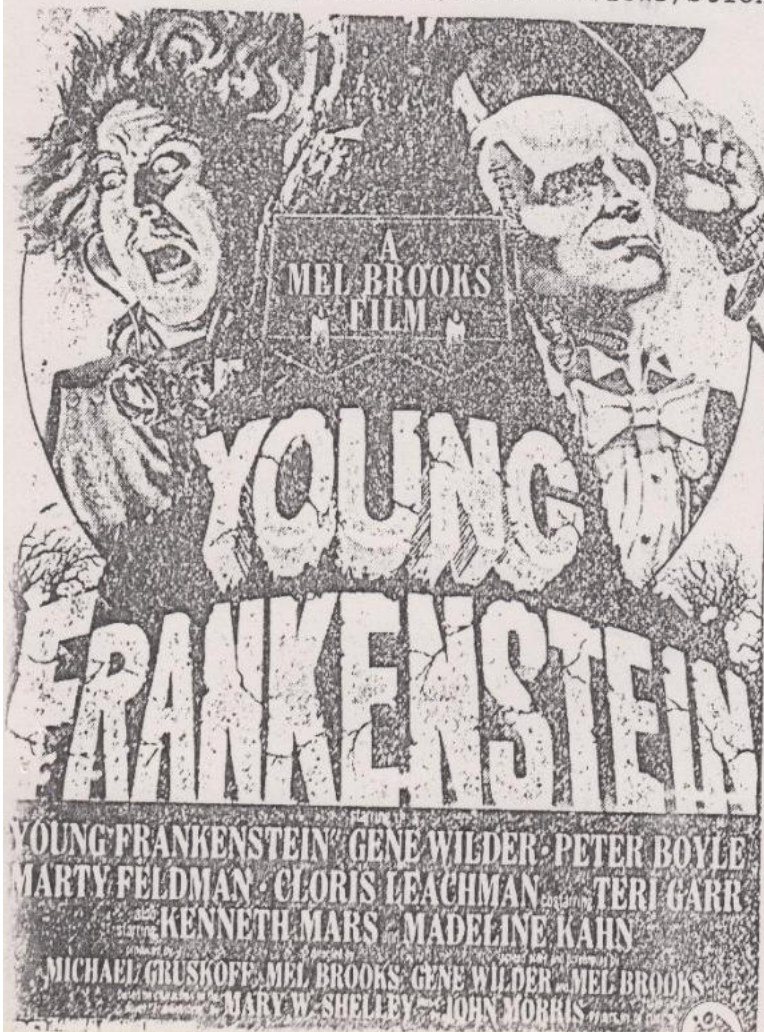

## The Strange Door

This movie was on Saturday, June 28th, and if you sat up watching it, you are probably still hitting your head against the wall because you stayed up watching it. 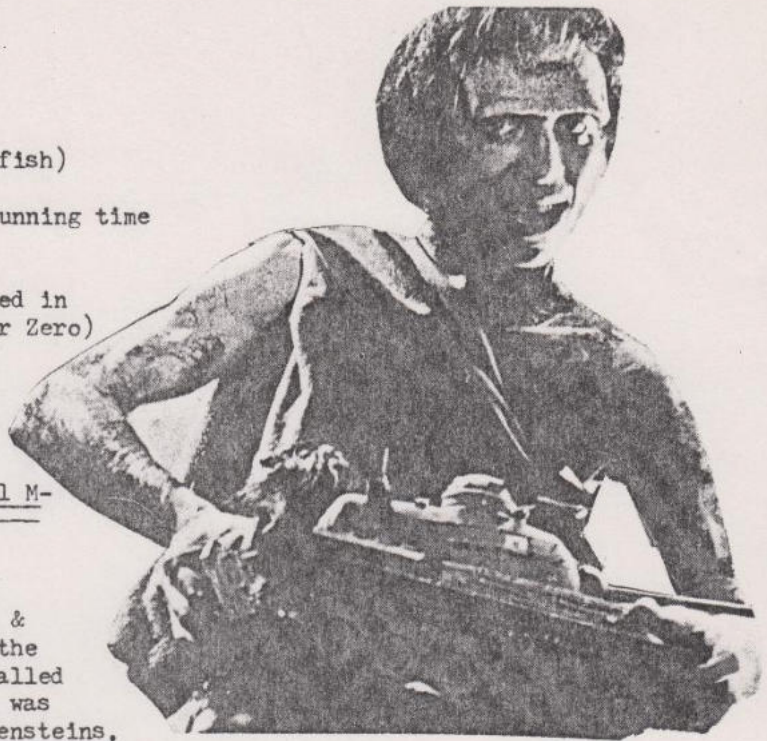

### KING KONG ESCAPES

Even though this movie was made a number of years after King Kong vs. Godzilla, it appears that King Kong vs. Godzilla is a sequel to King Kong Escapes. In King Kong Escapes, King Kong is only 60 feet tall. But in King Kong vs. Godzilla, Kong is at least 200 feet tall from the effects of a red berry found on Pharaoh island. Well, back to King Kong Escapes. The Kong in Escapes is only a man in a shaggy suit, instead of animated. A poor mans Kong.

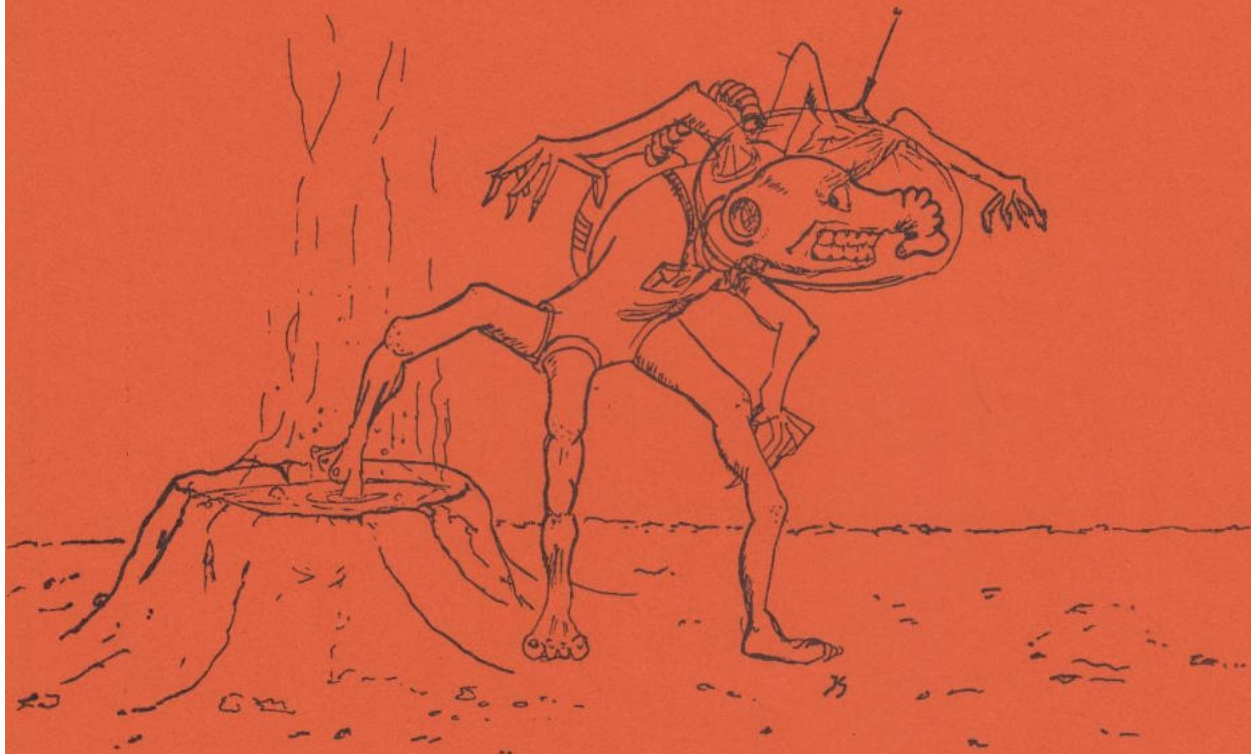
