



THE EIGHTH MAN (1965)

As an infantile little twerp, the Eightht Man (also called Tobor in the series, which I think might be android, but spelled sideways) was an even bigger hero to me than the Seventh Man or the Sixth Man, but not as big as the Nineth Man. Then one day somebody told me he was a lifeless drawing, only existing on flat sheets of clear plastic, not unlike those Shrinky Dink drawing sets from a few sentons ago. My life was shattered to learn that The Eigth Man was a mere 1-dimensional work of pen and paint. I had so desperately wanted to meet him, to get his autograph, and to have his baby, or die trying.



Upon return from the insane asylum, I continued to watch THE EIGHTH MAN and was able to follow the plot more closely, despite my painful dissilusionment from before. With my head clear, I could figure out that the script dealt with the animated adventures of a crime fighting organization located in Metro City, called Metro International Police. The accurately named Proffesor Genius revived the dead spirit of Peter Bradey, who, as you know, would later go on to star in THE BRADY BUNCH. He had died in the line of duty while battling a villain called (get this) Saucer Lip. So Professor Genius brought Peter Bradey back to life as the heroic robot Eighth Man.




