There have been many sci-fi stories dealing with the undersea lands. The first of these was Jules Verne classis, 20 000 Leagues Under the Sea. This has since been made into a movie, and there are scores of others dealing with undersea sci-fi. However, there have been relatively few series. But, the first of the undersea series was "Undersea Kingdom," which is a Flash Gordon type series of the late '30's. It's well done for the time, and is now being re-run between Creature Feature every Saturday night on KTVU. A more recent series is Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea, which was on ABC during the mid-60's. It is now being re-run on KTXL every Saturday night. This show is briefly told about at the bottom of the page, but now you can read about an undersea movie, that was recently made.

City Beneath the Sea

City Beneath the Sea is about an undersea city, much like Sealab. It is about a prescious gold and nuclear shipment that is being taken to the city, Pacifica. The founder of Pacifica has been called back to his job. Then, after all the work, it's threatened by a meteorite. A viewmaster show, with a tape, is in the Lance Library, free for members to see.

On one journey of the Deep Diver, he was a sceptic, as Gail




THE OIL SPILL THREAT
